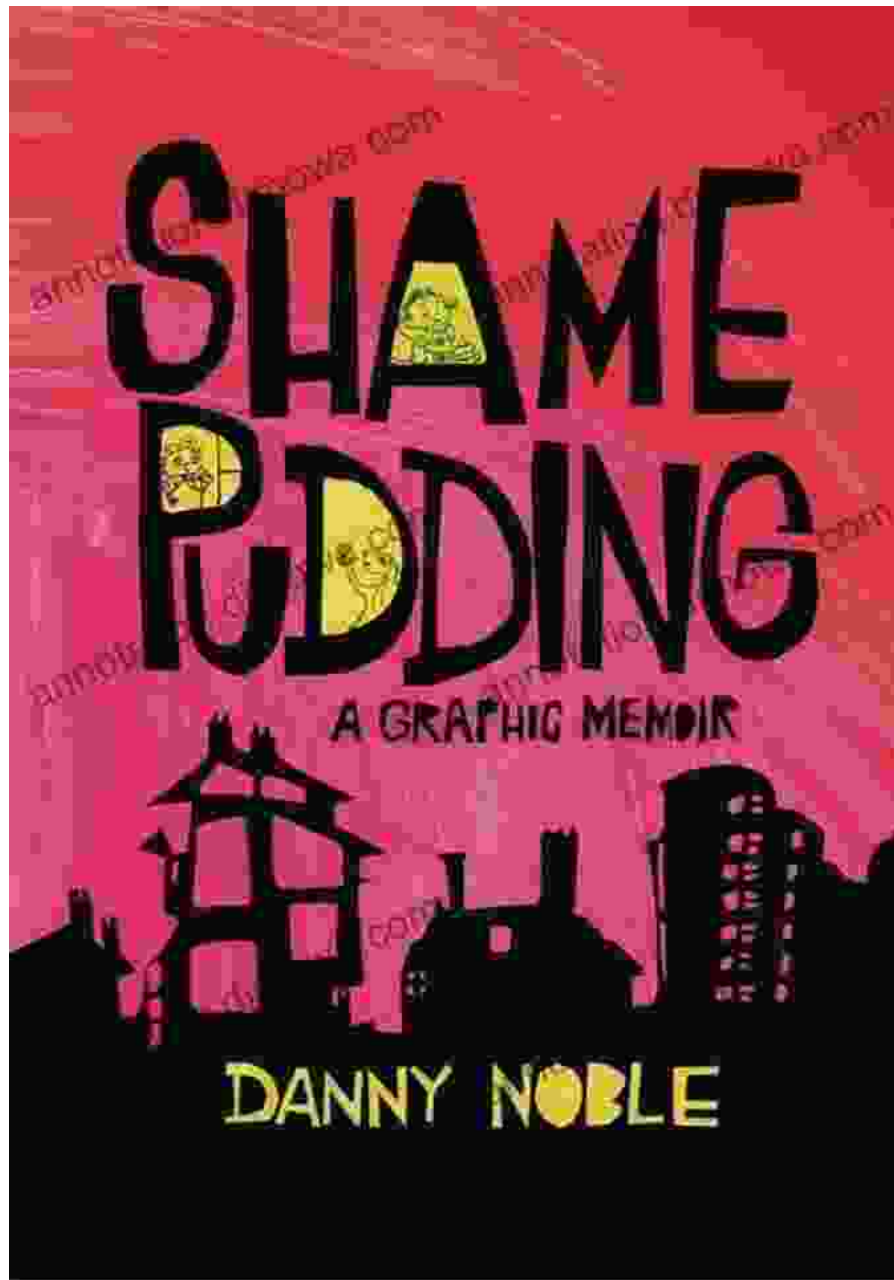


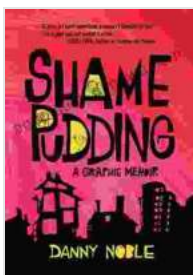
Shame Pudding: A Graphic Memoir of Decolonization

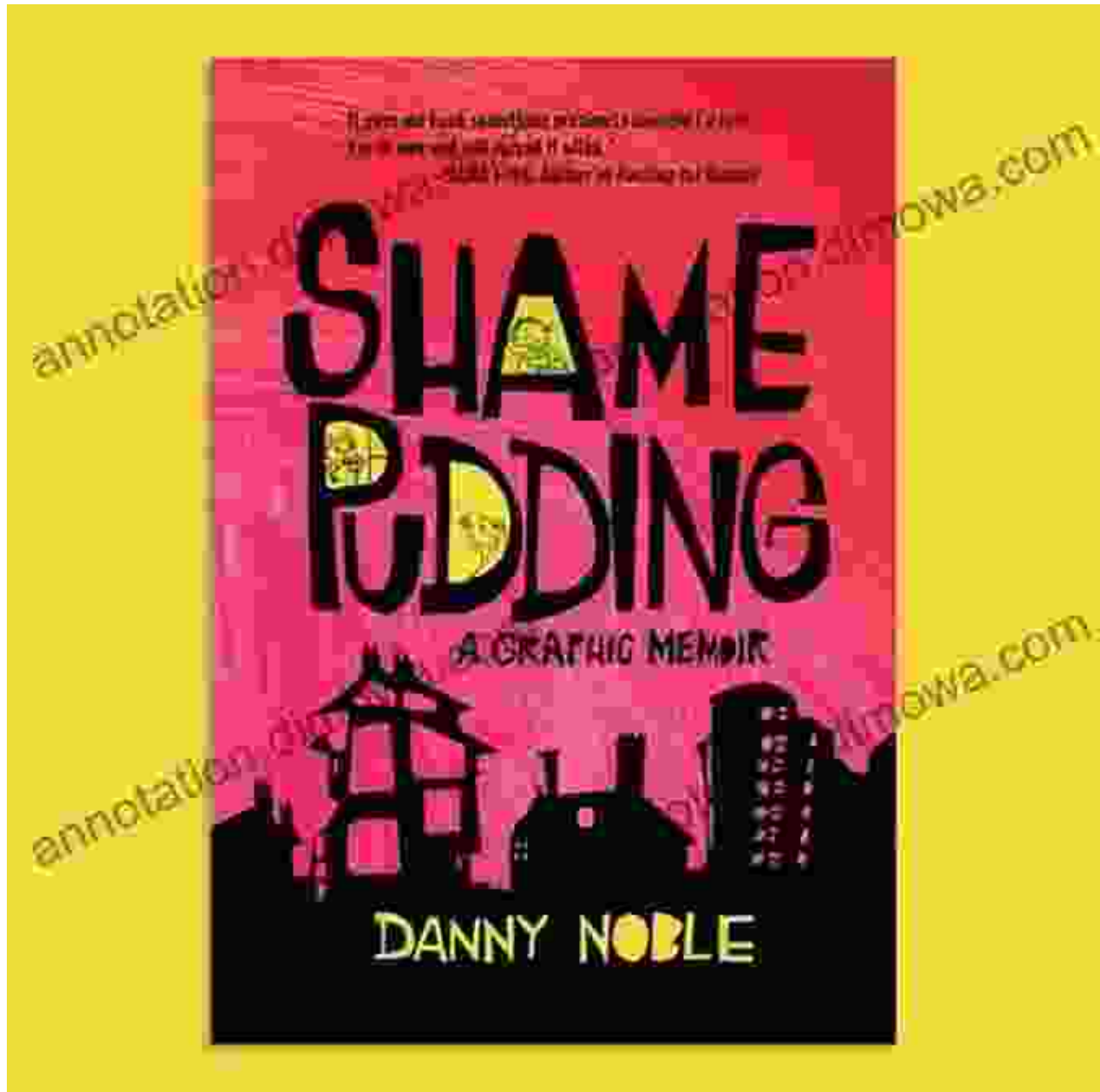

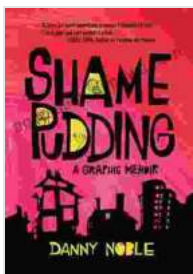
